Here are some interesting Easter facts that I came across: The history of Easter began in the 2nd century. While the earliest recorded observance of the holiday celebration occurred then, people commemorated the Resurrection earlier than that. Easter is the most important holiday of the Christian Church calendar. The Christian celebration of Easter is marked in around 95 countries across the world. Western Christianity observes Easter on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the spring equinox. Due to the complex calculations, Easter Sunday can be anytime from March 22 to April 25. The official flower of Easter is the white lily. It symbolizes grace, purity, rebirth, new beginnings and hope. The first recorded use of decorated Easter eggs was in the 13th century. The rising of Jesus from the tomb is associated with the emergence of new from an egg's shell. Eventually it evolved into an official symbol of the Resurrection.

As we prepare for Easter, let us not forget the people who are struggling to put food on the table each day. Needed for the month of March at the Food Pantry are boxes of cereal, instant oatmeal, boxes of instant potatoes and 5.5oz. tubes of toothpaste.
